First Flight: Tom Branham won with a three day total of 223. His fantastic first round of 70 was a personal best. Wes Skinner finished second at 229 followed by Terry Kirchoffner at 235.

Second Flight: Sal Mantione won with a three day total of 243. Steve Kratochvil was second at 244 followed by John Philpot and Art Prouty at 245.

Third Flight: Frank Runions won with a total of 255. Dave Bolly was second at 257 followed by Greg Nussberger at 267.

Pace of Play: A time tracking form will be used in each group in future events. We ask you to please cooperate with this effort to increase awareness of our pace of play and turn these forms in with your scorecards at the end of the round. Some hints for faster play:

- When you notice that your group is falling behind, make sure to tell the rest of your group that you need to catch up, and then do so.
- Prepare and plan your next shot while others are playing theirs.
- Always hit a provisional ball if your ball might be lost and not in a hazard.
- Look for other ways you can save time while still enjoying your game, such as putting head covers on while driving to the next shot, etc.

Handicapping: It is expected that members will post ALL 18 hole scores regardless of when and where they are played, not just Fred Enke Golf Club Tournament scores. If you do not understand how to post, The Handicap Chairman or the pro shop staff can show you how to sign on and use the Handicap Computer located in the Fred Enke Pro Shop. Jeff Parfenchuck is the Handicap Chair with Steve Holly and Tom Owens forming the Handicap Committee. It is your responsibility to ensure your handicap is accurate.

- Post an accurate adjusted score for every round of golf that you play as soon as possible after the round. Post every round for every course, whether you played well or poorly.
- Do not post scores for FEGC events. The Handicap Chairman posts these for you. You are responsible for posting any other scores.
- Make sure you post from the correct tees.
- Adjust your score according to the USGA Equitable Stroke Control System below:

Your Current Handicap	Maximum Score on Any Hole
0-9	Double Bogey
10-19	7
20-29	8
30-39	9

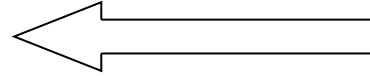
